- Student learning engagement continues to be an area of strength for MMH. We continue to seek innovative and exciting learning opportunities for students to experience through the practice of inquiry/project-based learning, hands on learning and connections to real world learning.
- Mike Mountain Horse has surpassed the provincial response for Education Quality. This continues to be a priority for teaching and leading as we have implemented new curriculum over the past three years.
- Education quality results demonstrate Mike Mountain Horse's active and engaged teaching staff have implemented and support the new curriculum in exceptional ways.

Areas for growth

Challenges

- We continue to focus on creating a welcoming, caring, respectful and safe environment. Seeking opportunities to connect with students and families to support feeling welcome and cared for will be a priority.
- Results indicate citizenship is an area of concern and has declined quite substantially compared to previous years. Active engagement with families and staff explore options to support citizenship growth and development in the school will be created.
- A continued area of growth is family participation in completing the survey. Results do not provide a broad scope of views from
 our school community and so we will be seeking methods to better inform families of the importance of the survey as well as
 providing more information to families about how the school is working to support student growth and development. To support
 his, we have created a brochure to be sent home to all families showcasing the learning, events, activities and celebrations that
 take place at the school.

Evaluation

Supporting student growth and development as active citizens continues to be a focus for MMH. To support these developing skills, we will:

- Implement a greater focus on community service projects such as field trips to the food bank, food drives, supporting local first responders through letter and card campaigns.
- Continue to promote active citizenship within the school through:
 - Support various community causes such as the Terry Fox Run and collecting toonies for Terry, food collection for the food bank, etc.
 - Spirit Assemblies and teaching students the character traits of the Seven Sacred Teachings (Courage, Respect, Humility, Truth, Wisdom, Honesty, Love).
 - o Promote a culture of kindness using BOOST notes, recognizing, acknowledging and celebrating actions that demonstrate kindness.
 - Celebrate Re3 Heros in our school who show initiative in taking care of our school spaces
 - Highlight Social Emotional Learning to support student growth and development (Second Step, Kids in the Know, Little Spot Feelings).
 - Consistently review and reteach Positive School Wide Behaviour expectations for all students, staff and community members in our building.
- Continue to support and coach staff and families on how to support students to work through conflicts, take responsibility for actions and seek positive methods of problem solving.

An ongoing goal for MMH will be to highlight and showcase the acts of citizenship our school community is involved in and how these impact our school culture.

Evaluation

- We see an increase from last year with parent satisfaction of the overall quality of education offered.
- Continue to build a shared understanding of best practice in literacy instruction including reading and writing workshop models, guided reading, targeted word work instruction and consistent high quality literacy interventions.
- Continue to create shared understanding of the importance of a deep understanding of number sense as the foundation for numeracy instruction in all grades.
- A slight decrease in teacher satisfaction indicates and need to provide teachers with time and support to dive deeply into the new Alberta Education K-6 curriculum. Providing teachers with collaborative time and support to explore the curriculum, gather resources and plan for student engagement will continue to support quality education for all students.

Evaluation

As we seek creative ways to provide students access to the supports and services they require, MMH will:

- Continue to engage with the school division to seek creative solutions to meet the needs of students.
- Work with staff, teachers and educational assistants, to seek ways to support students within the school moving away from a more traditional model of one-on-one support to flexing our time to engage in the important work of supporting all students.
- Utilize the monthly school newsletter to share communication of community and school division supports and services available to our school community.
- Teacher Counsellor and Family Support Worker will work closely together to ensure students and families are supported at school and at

home. This will include connecting with supports from community partners such as The Family Centre, Children's Allied Health, Children's Mental Health, My City Care, and the Food Bank.

- Continue to access additional school division funding such as Nutrition Grants, Poverty intervention Grants and Wellness Grants to support families and students.
- Continue to inform families about divisional services support families within and outside of the school such as Mental Health Capacity Building team and Family Support Workers.

Evaluation

- Continue to advocate and advertise parent involvement in School Council and School Council Society meetings and events.

- Continue with and increase family targeted events at the school including Meet the Teacher, Parent-Teacher interviews, Celebration of Learning, and family engagement evenings such as Family Fitness events, Book Fair, Grade 5 Basketball and Volleyball.
- Continue to encourage families to attend school celebrations such as Spirit Assemblies where students have the opportunity to host assemblies, perform at assemblies and are recognized for their gifts and strengths through the Seven Sacred Teachings.
- Continued use of DOJO, email, classroom newsletters, school newsletter and agendas to support family engagement with the school

Evaluation

To ensure students at Mike Mountain Horse Elementary continue to engage in a broad program of studies, we will:

- Support staffing a music specialist enabling students to access and explore music and movement
- Support teachers time in offering extra-curricular options such as choir, handbells, soccer club, chess club, drama club.
- Students will continue to have access to computers and technology with a consistent schedule of learning in either the computer lab or their classrooms using laptops.
- Continuing to expand our Maker Space program which allows all students access to explore a variety of curriculum-based, engaging activities supporting Science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics (STEAM) supporting collaboration, critical thinking and problem solving.
- Continue to support and encourage outdoor learning opportunities and exploration of our natural environment to encourage the value of healthy living and a connection to nature.

In previous years, we have been challenged by the size of our school and providing daily access to the gym. Our goal for the coming year as our enrollment decreases is to provide each class with four classes in the gym each week.

 monthly assemblies, help students in lower grades during nutrition breaks, and engage in helping teachers make arrangements for guest
 speakers, field trips and special events.
- Continue to support teachers and students in understanding the WHY behind their learning and make connections to authentic, real-world problems and activities in day-to-day learning as well as highlighted in Inquiry Based Learning projects.
- Foster a shared value for and belief in developing skills such as critical thinking, curiosity, problem solving, communication and empathy.
- Continue to highlight and showcase to families how classroom learning is directly linked to lifelong learning, ensuring students understand the connections and applications of this learning.
