Principal's Report: Kerry Taylor

- Professional Learning:
 - Upcoming: Dr. Robin Bright supporting Comprehensive Literacy Classrooms Kindergarten to Grade 5.
 - 3 full day PL sessions with teachers beginning in the fall
 - The hope is during the second year she will do some residencies in the classroom
 - Assessment How to make assessment more meaningful, student-centered, contain voice and align with academic growth. Related to our new outcomes-based report card.
 - Myron Dueck will be coming in a leadership role to help support this next year
- Information Updates:
 - Pilot Report Card Information from Erin Hurkett
 - A 7-slide video was shown that discussed the purpose of report card comments.
 - It is to provide a personalized overview of each student's academic performance and personal development.
 - Student Strengths (learning, personal)
 - Student Areas of Growth (academic, personal, effort)
 - Student Supports (at school, and partnerships with home)
 - An example comment was provided for viewing
 - A QR code was provided for anyone wishing to give comments or feedback
 - Discussion was had about whether report cards could be emailed home from teachers to parents as a simple PDF. This would make it easier for parents who may not have a desktop to view it and haven't requested a paper copy.
 - o Great turn out for Celebrations of Learning
 - The best participation we have had in years
 - Sending enrollment projections into Ed Centre in March, April, May
 - Staffing in very earliest stages
 - West Coulee has been staffed. Brittany Petkau and Marie Lowe will be moving over to the new elementary school in the fall.

- It is still unknown how many teachers MMH will be allotted for next year
- Screen Time a form survey was sent to staff asking how often they are using screens in the classroom. It is about a 50/50 split on staff of who uses it during nutrition break – a variation of movies/YouTube, some are informing parents, and some are not.
- Mindful Eating lower grades do 5 minutes of not talking, some of the older grades have a maximum of 12 minutes without talking during nutrition break. It was a good data collection and provides insight for next year.
- Assurance Survey for Grade 4 families just closed on the 28th and response was low but still the most it has been in awhile.

 - No Division report yet, because they meet on Monday
 - Proxy Vote Decisions
 - ASCA said we didn't have a membership with them when Danica registered, so they are billing the division because it was requested that MMH be signed up for it back in September.
 - 5 Topics to Vote on Today:

 <u>Electrical School Busses in Alberta – Pilot Program</u> – a request for the Minister of Education to fund about a dozen electric school bus pilot projects in diverse rural and urban districts across AB. – Consensus: VOTE NO
 <u>Mandatory funding for specialist teachers in elementary schools</u> – gym, music, library, and a resource teacher must be mandatory for all elementary schools. --- Consensus: VOTE YES

3. <u>Sunlight is the best disinfectant</u> – asking for a public report that includes how our public schools are functioning to ameliorate the issues caused by lack of public knowledge and misinformation. --- Consensus **VOTE NO**

4. <u>Discontinue Mandatory Timed Testing of Kindergarteners to Grade 3</u> – Consensus **VOTE YES**

5. <u>Online Safety</u> – Minister of Education needs to mandate that each board must establish a committee composed of representatives including educators, counselors, law enforcement, parents, and community members to recognize, respond, and report regarding all harm to students. In addition, there needs to be mandatory instruction for teens on the reporting of online harms, risks of sharing digital consent, harms of exposure to pornography and awareness of resources available for support. Lastly, each board must ensure that student records are anonymized and encrypted. – Consensus **VOTE NO**

Trustee Report: Andrea Andreachuk

- Funding has been allocated for a new Westside elementary school on the far south side. Land has been allocated.
- Pre-planning money has been approved for the modernization of LCI to allow for more accessibility.
- ICE Scholarship showcase was March 27th and there were 26 tables of kids with projects. This is the 9th year and there was good community support.
- Morag Asquith reported that the kindergarten evening was well attended
- Indigenous Education group had a PL session and took staff to the Buffalo Jump
- March 17th staff in the division had collaborative groups
- KinderCare in the division received recognition with an article in the newspaper
- Mike Nightingale spoke to the ATA about the budget and that was appreciated

- The Spirit of 51 support staff awards happened and it was well attended with 150 support staff receiving recognition and getting cookie kits.
- The new report card was discussed and how it is being communicated to parents
- Robbie Charlebois in HR spoke about West Coulee Station being mostly staffed and there will be movement this year with teachers
- A restructured teacher mentorship program is coming back so that is exciting news
- Acknowledgement of excellence GS Lakie was highlighted FISH FRIDAYS continues to be a success. As well as Galbraith and Senator Buchanon with their highlights
- May 7th is the next conversation opportunity with the board location is TBD but it will take place in the evening
- Christine Light talked about the city and the two school divisions continuing their partnership
- ASCA money was approved for councils
- A mom from SJF came to talk about food insecurity they are seeing 40% more use of the food bank.
- Transportation \$413,000 deficit from bussing at the 1KM. The government is funding 1.6 KM distance for K-6 and 2KM for 7-12
- Edwar Parr Nominee was named Gr. 1 teacher from Nicholas Sheran
- School fee discussion was tabled because more information is needed about discrepancies amongst schools.
- The budget was presented, and capital plan was approved. Most growth is expected on the west side Chinook is operating at 140% of its capacity and 500 westside students are being bussed to LCI. A new high school on the westside is next priority.
- Trustee code of conduct passed the first reading, it was tabled for now.
- Breakfast with the board has been brought back to schools taking trustees into the buildings
- New Teacher Induction happened for the ATA
